Dementia Friends Training



We have spent a lot of time in June training local businesses in and around the Holywood area and Bangor, and we have secured more training dates with the North Down and Ards Borough Council.


What is Dementia?

We started in April providing our readers with some background knowledge of the various types of dementia.

In April we provided information on Alzheimer's Disease and Vascular Dementia.

In May we provided information on Dementia with Lewy Bodies and Korsakoff's Dementia. In this edition we will be focusing on CJD - Creutzfeldt - Jakob Disease.

CJD is a prion disease and occurs when prion protein found throughout the body develops in the brain and destroys brain cells. Resulting damage leads to rapid decline in thinking and reasoning as well as involuntary muscle movements, confusion, difficulty walking and mood changes. CJD is rare, occurring in about one in a million people annually worldwide.



Signs & Symptoms of CJD:

- 1. Depression
- 2. Agitation, apathy and mood swings.
- 3. Rapidly worsening confusion, disorientation, and problems with memory, thinking, planning and judgement.
- 4. Difficulty walking.
- 5. Muscle stiffness, twitches and involuntary jerky movements.

There is no treatment that can slow or stop the underlying brain cell destruction caused by CJD. Current therapies focus on treating symptoms and on supporting individuals and their families coping with the symptoms and rapid progression of CJD.

Anyone know a Dementia Friendly Barber?

Some of you may have met Lenny White at our Official Launch / Open Day in May.

Lenny has joined the Dementia
Friendly Community Steering
Group, and has been getting a
lot of positive publicity in local
newspapers, radio and social media.
Therefore, we thought we would
give him a mention in this month's
newsletter.

Lenny White's dementia-friendly barber business has been a big hit in Northern Ireland, and he's now setting his sights on the rest of the UK.

For people living with dementia, remaining independent and participating in local communities can be both daunting and frustrating.

Lenny White, 35, the mobile barber from Northern Ireland who has made it his mission to make a difference for the men living with dementia in his local area.

Having previously worked in a nursing home kitchen, Lenny noticed that the hairdressing services were often more tailored towards women – from the lighting and decor to the general conversation.



'Men love getting together with other men and having a bit of banter,' says Lenny. 'Just because someone has dementia, it doesn't mean they have to lose out on things like this.'

Lenny's mobile barber shop provides one solution, bringing haircuts to the homes of those who aren't able to get to their local barber shop. Whether it's a care home, day centre, hospital or residential setting, Lenny recreates the traditional barber shop experience and helps restore some dignity to his customers.

As well as barber shop signs, old photographs and hot towels, Lenny also brings along an old jukebox so that his customers can sing along to the classics.

'When my clients come into the barber room they hear the music and smell the different scents and it seems to instantly relax them. I play Elvis Presley, Dean Martin, Frank Sinatra and have many a sing song with my clients – it's amazing to watch.'

While Lenny admits to knowing 'very little' about dementia beforehand, he's since become a Dementia Friend and enrolled in specialist dementia training with Dementia Friendly Holywood, Radius Housing.



'I've learned to meet them where they're at. I'm usually quite a fast person, always go go go, and since starting my business and working with people with dementia I am learning to slow way down, be patient and talk them through it.'

'Dementia is just so common nowadays,' he says. 'Every business should be dementia friendly.'
